



EXPLANATORY NOTE:

In the case of the Navy and Marine Corps Expeditionary Medals & China Service Medal, there were earlier campaigns/overseas duty locations recognized. But for the purpose of this chart, only post-World War II actions are listed.

Also, some countries currently covered by the Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal also fall under the AFEM (Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal) in earlier years.

HOSTILE FIRE & IMMINENT DANGER PAY

Receipt of these special pays has qualified veterans for membership since Congress amended VFWøs charter on October 16, 2002. (*P.L. 107 - 242*).

*IMPORTANT: Though sometimes confused or used interchangeably, Hostile Fire Pay (HFP) and Imminent Danger Pay (IDP) are distinct. HFP is an õevent-based pay,ö meaning a service member must actually face hostile fire or explosion of an enemy mine. IDP is a õthreat-based payö and goes to service members assigned to areas deemed dangerous by the Pentagon. Imminent danger can be caused by civil war, terrorism or wartime conditions.

HFP of IDP is verified through a service member (and Earnings Statement (DFAS Form 702), issued by the Army, Navy, Air Force and Coast Guard. The Marine Corps issues the DFAS-KC Form 7220/39.
