#### **Administrative Operations**

- There are currently 73 Posts under suspension; 13 of which are new with seven suspensions lifted since last week. We are working to institute one new Post; we have completed two and are working two Post consolidations; we are working two charter surrenders; we are working four and have completed three charter revocations pursuant to Sections 201, 209, 210 and 212 of the National Bylaws. The organization has 5,812 chartered Posts.
- Administrative Operations is engaged in 11 Article IX Disciplinary Actions, 23 administrative actions and eight membership eligibility challenges.
- We have six Bylaws/Articles of Incorporation submissions in for review and received 15 new submissions for the week. Current turnaround time on Bylaws/Articles of Incorporation submissions is approximately one week.

# National Legislative Service

 The House Committee on Veterans' Affairs conducted a hearing on VA programs for suicide prevention, intervention, postvention, and VA-sponsored research and community efforts. VFW National Legislative Service Deputy Director Tammy Barlet provided a statement for the record that outlined the VFW's priority to end veteran suicide, concerns regarding VA's <u>2022 National Veteran Suicide Prevention Annual Report</u>, and results from VFW's Fall 2022 Health Survey. "The VFW is working to ensure a way forward in the collective mission to end veteran suicide once and for all," said Barlet. <u>Watch the hearing</u> or <u>read the testimony</u>.

- Calling all changemakers who are interested in the topics of challenges for service members and military families, transition from military to civilian life, improving veterans' health care and benefits, and student veteran success on campus and beyond. The VFW-SVA Legislative Fellowship is a semester-long program open to ambitious student veterans who are currently a VFW member or VFW-eligible, and who attend an accredited institution of higher learning. Highlights of the program include attending the Student Veterans of America (SVA) National Conference in Orlando, Florida, and the VFW Legislative Conference in Washington, D.C. The application process for this valuable experience **closes at midnight on Oct. 15.** Learn more and apply for the fellowship.
- TRICARE has announced that beginning on Oct. 24, 2022, thousands of community pharmacies will leave the network. Express Scripts is the TRICARE pharmacy contractor with oversight of home delivery, military pharmacy, and civilian contract facilities. Walmart and Sam's Club pharmacies are among those impacted by this change. It is recommended that you contact your pharmacy to see if it will remain in network. Find a <u>participating pharmacy</u> near you. <u>Read more</u>.
- As of Oct. 1, 2022, VA is expanding health care eligibility for certain veterans as directed by the recent passage into law of the *Honoring our PACT Act*. A one-year open enrollment period will be available for eligible Vietnam veterans, Gulf War veterans, and Post-9/11 veterans. Eligibility is based on dates and locations of service, regardless of disability claim status. Once the open enrollment period has closed, veterans from these groups will be eligible for VA health care as part of a phased process depending on discharge date. Learn more about your eligibility and apply today.
- The VFW currently <u>supports 176 bills</u>; and <u>opposes one bill</u> pending before the 117th Congress.
