# **Administrative Operations**

- There are currently 72 Posts under suspension; one of which is new with three suspensions lifted since last week. We have completed one and are working one Post consolidation; we are working six and have completed one charter revocation pursuant to Sections 209 and 212 of the National Bylaws. The organization has 5,827 chartered Posts.
- Administrative Operations is engaged in 15 Article IX Disciplinary Actions, 15 administrative actions and seven membership eligibility challenges.
- We have eight Bylaws/Articles of Incorporation submissions in for review, five of which are new. Current turnaround time on Bylaws/Articles of Incorporation submissions is approximately one week.

### **National Legislative Service**

- Reform to retirement pay and disability compensation policy is long overdue. Many of our nation's combat-disabled veterans are prohibited by Congress from receiving their full earned Department of Defense retirement pay and Department of Veterans Affairs service-connected disability compensation. Over 50,000 Chapter 61 retirees with combat-related disabilities are required to forfeit every dollar of their retirement pay for every dollar they receive in disability compensation. No veteran should have to choose between two fundamentally different benefits that they earned for two entirely different reasons. Tell Congress to end this extremely unjust offset by immediately passing the Major Richard Star Act. Click here to send a letter to your congressional offices requesting action.
- Your VFW legislative team and Jon Stewart held a tell-all on the ups, downs and drama leading to the passage of the Honoring our PACT Act. This is the most comprehensive legislation for toxic exposure that Congress has passed to date. Watch the Podcast.
- VA has extended its financial hardship suspension on benefit debts through Dec. 31, 2022. This relief option was established to help veterans through the COVID-19 pandemic and was set to expire on Sep. 30. Beginning this month, VA will mail debt notification letters to affected veterans advising them of the extended hardship suspension option, as well as

extended debt repayment plans, waivers, or compromises. This includes debts related to disability compensation, non-service-connected pension, and education benefits. Veterans and beneficiaries can manage their debt <u>online</u> or call 800.827.0648 with questions regarding benefit overpayments.
