From the Commander:

When we say Goodbye to Customs and Traditions.

The Veterans of Foreign Wars is a nonprofit veterans service organization comprised of eligible veterans and military service members from the Active, Guard and Reserve forces. Founded in 1899 and chartered by Congress in 1936, we are the nation's largest organization of war veterans and its oldest major veterans organization.

We are an organization that was established with the desire to helping Veterans, and built on Customs, Traditions, and Rituals. Cultural loss refers to the disappearance of cultural elements, such as traditions, languages, art, and social practices that define a group of people. It's a process that can occur due to various factors, such as, globalization, colonialism, modernization, and environmental changes.

The 21st century has its benefits for sure, but it brings its own share of problems as well. Customs, Traditions, and Rituals are the umbrella for the Veterans of Foreign Wars, but it seems like we are now forgetting to take our umbrella with us, as customs and tradition seems to be taking a backseat in our busy lives.

REGISTER YOUR POST & AUXILIARY

From the Secretary of State:

If your charitable organization no longer falls under the exemption provisions of the statute, it is very important that your organization register as a non-exempt charitable organization with the Secretary of State's office using the Registration Statement for a Charitable Organization. Failure to file the proper registration statement may result in an administrative fine of up to \$2000.

To file your application online, please visit the Secretary of State's website at https://sos.sc.gov/before-you-file-online

The Secretary of State's free **Give Smart SC** mobile app is now available! Before you make a donation, use **Give Smart SC** to see if a charity is registered to solicit in South Carolina, and review information provided on the charity's most recent annual financial report.

Give Smart SC is available through the App Store and Google Play. Remember to always give from the heart, but give smart!

Registration is easy and will prevent a lot of headaches should you get audited by the State.



Wreaths for the Veterans' Victory House



All Posts & Auxiliaries within District 1 are asked to submit a Buddy Poppy Christmas Wreath, which will be given to the Victory House, located at <u>2461 Sidneys Road</u>, <u>Walterboro</u>, <u>SC 29488</u>. The Posts will not get these back.

The Buddy Poppy Christmas Wreath should be no bigger than 16 inches, and light enough to hang on a door. The wreath should contain at least 1 Buddy Poppy with the paper tag still attached. These wreaths need to be brought to the District Meeting on November 15th, 2025 that will be held at Post 5091, and there they will also be judged with a winner selected.

Please do not decorate with the following items:

No candy, or anything that looks like candy No glass items, for fear of breaking No sharp or pointed items No vulgar language or obscene gestures



Be The Light Pantry — Supporting Military Families During the Government Shutdown

During the 2019 government shutdown, a grassroots effort called Be The Light Pantry was created to support U.S. Coast Guard families in Astoria, Oregon — serving more than 1,300 people in need.

Now, as another government shutdown impacts service members and federal workers across the country, Be The Light Pantry is being established in Moncks Corner, South Carolina, to support all branches of the military, retirees, and furloughed federal employees across Berkeley, Charleston, and surrounding counties.

The pantry will take place on October 18th & 19th at VFW Post 9509 & Auxiliary, in partnership with Towns4Troops-SE, a nonprofit accepting donations on behalf of the pantry, and Benchmark Structures, who are generously donating a large shed to serve as the pantry space.

To make this effort possible, we're asking for the community's support:

- Donations of nonperishable food, household essentials, and personal care items (no expired or opened items. please).
- Donations can be dropped off at <u>232 Firewheel Court Summerville</u>, <u>SC</u>.
- Gift cards valued at \$25 or less, which will be distributed directly to families in need.
- Monetary donations can be made via Venmo @Towns4TroopsSE. These funds will be used to purchase additional gift cards and essential items such as groceries and gas for affected families.. If you can't donate please share to help us get the word out to as many people as possible.
