****For all you displaced Western New York folks:-** Who want their final resting place to be a National Cemetery back home. The VA has just opened a National Cemetery in western New York. It is

in CORFU and about 20 miles East of Buffalo. It has space for 77,100 veterans/family's, so there's no rush in getting there. To get info on this cemetery you can go to the VA National Cemetery Administration or call 800-535-1117.

NOTE: The VA has six other National Cemetery's in New York State, but the one in Cypress Hills (Brooklyn) is closed to new membership.

****What's with all the hats ???** As a new or relatively new member, you attend a VFW meeting and you see all these members with different VFW hats and you say to yourself, what am I looking at? Well. Amongst all that variety and color. There is order to what hat you can wear. Let's try to simplify things; **A hat with GOLD piping (the trim around the top of the hat) is for members at the POST level. There is also a 'suntan' (a light BROWN) hat for any member.

**A hat with GREEN piping, or all green is for officers at the DISTRICT level (bottom left below).

**A hat with RED piping is for a DISTRICT or DEPARTMENT Commander only.

**A hat with BLACK piping is an all-purpose hat.

**A hat with WHITE piping or the hat all WHITE is for elected or appointed officers at the NATIONAL level.

If you are a LIFE MEMBER, you can wear the special Life Member hat (top left of the group below)

NAMETAGS – Your VFW nametag should be the same color of the braid (piping) on the hat you are wearing.



IMPORTANT: Once a Post, District, Department or National meeting starts. The only hat you can wear is one of the authorized VFW caps. No other type head cover is allowed.

Example: As veterans, if you are classified disabled by the VA? You don't have to serve on a jury. If you are 70 or older, you do not have to serve on a jury.

P.S. As a 74 year old, disabled veteran, I am scheduled for Grand Jury Duty on March 9th. I'm doing my part!!

<u>VETERAN SUICIDES</u> – There is always something being said or posted about the need to do something to decrease the number of veteran suicides. The VA has just published their veteran suicide statistics for 2018 (the most current numbers) for those veterans <u>under the VA Care system</u>. Below are some of the findings published by the VA:

*First off – the number of veteran suicides was 17.6 per day compared to the civilian population of 127.4 per day. This equates to 6,435 veteran suicides in 2018, with the total veteran population down to 20.1 million US veterans worldwide. There were 46,500 adult, non-veteran, suicides in 2018, an increase of 2.5% over 2017.

*66.4 veterans per 100,000 were being treated for or suffered from DEPRESSION

*67.4 veterans per 100,000 were being treated for or suffered from ANXIETY

- *57.2 veterans per 100,000 were being treated for or suffered from MENTAL HEALTH issues
- * These rates are the lowest in the last six (6) years
- * There were 291 WOMEN veteran suicides in 2018, with 81 being under the VA Care System

*Veterans who identify with the LGBT community are at an elevated risk of suicide.

*Veterans who identify as Lesbian, Gay, Bi-Sexual are more likely to report suicidal tendencies and will screen positive for PTSD, Depression and Alcoholism

*Blacks, Hispanics and Females had decreased suicide numbers in 2018.

*To commit suicide 69.4% of males and 41.9% of females used firearms,

***It is important to note that veterans with service-connected disabilities show a lower risk of committing suicide

***Veterans between the ages of 18 and 34 have the highest suicide rate per 100,000

DoD just completed their 2019 Suicide Study and found:

*That in 2019, there were 498 Active Duty service members committed suicide. The highest number being among younger enlisted personnel.

*That suicide rates among National Guard and Reserve personnel is going down.

*In 2018 there were 193 family members who committed suicide.

In the last couple of years, both the VA & DoD have added over 2,000 more counselors to help anyone contemplating suicide. Along with the help-line contact information listed at the start of this newsletter. Personnel can contact a Suicide Hotline by texting 838255 or VeteransCrisisLine.net/chat

****The National Desert Storm and Desert Shield Memorial** – Has finally received enough federal oversight blessings to start planning the actual construction of the memorial. They organizers say they still need \$20 million before they can begin construction, which will begin at a yet undetermined date in 2021. The site will be in close proximity to the Vietnam Veterans Memorial and will be a 'landscape based' memorial. Back in 2015, when the memorial was first proposed. The VFW pledged \$500,000 to the project. VFW Post 7564 in Fargo, ND contributed \$19,000 to the memorial.

Council of Administration – 30 January 2021 (some happenings)



The State CofA held on January 30th shows the continuing need to incorporate electronic communications not only at state level but all levels of VFW operations. There were 28 members present at the meeting and another 25 (more or less) present by way of ZOOM. ZOOM participants included National Sr. Vice-Commander in Chief Matthew (Fritz) Mihelcic and he congratulated the state for getting more members involved by way of electronic communications.

To comply with the Commander's interest in brevity. There were no District reports from the District Commanders and no reports from the various Committee Chairperson's. The following is **MY** summary of the CofA along with some award pictures.

*Before the CofA started, past State Commander Rodney Burne gave a training session on the Post/District Inspection Form. His emphasis was on Item 2 (Post Incorporation) and compliance with National By-Laws Section 708 and the fact many posts are not in compliance. He also emphasized that

all Post's **MUST** be incorporated with the state and that they should be incorporated as a 501c(19), NOT a 501c(3) or (4).

***Past Commander Burne also cautioned that if a post dissolves. All of the assets of the post REVERT TO THE STATE VFW. Post leadership CANNOT divide (among the membership) or sell post assets. Along with all post assets, the state also assumes all dissolved post liabilities.

*The CofA determines the salary of paid state VFW employees. Given that fact, the CofA voted to raise the salary of the Department Service Officer to \$50,000 a year to be more consistent with DSO salaries across the country.

****NOTE – Our state Veterans Service Officer has resigned and the Department is looking for a DEDICATED replacement. If you may be interested in this full-time position? Contact State Adjutant Hilliard before February 25th for additional information.

*If you want to be a Delegate at District, State or National VFW events. You must be elected as a delegate at your post's April (election) meeting.

*There is a new FISHER HOUSE being constructed in Columbia.

*State finances are in good shape.

*There were 129 MIA identified and returned to families in 2020.

*National now has Poppy's. If you are in need, you should place your orders. Remember, the people making the Poppy's are disabled veterans employed to give them a better chance in life.

*In 2020, SCVFW gave \$3,853 to the National Home for Children. Today's meeting generated \$113 for the National Home.

*As of right now, **the State Convention is still on** for June 22-23 at Embassy Suites for \$112 a night. ALSO the **National Convention in Baltimore** is still a go. Details will be posted on state web-site.

*State Chaplain Wilton Fowler reported that he is getting VERY FEW reports from District & Post Chaplain's. Every Chaplain is required to provide updates to the state. ALSO – Chaplain Fowler is looking for Post Chaplain nominees for Chaplain of the Year consideration.
