Districts first appeared in the 1931 Bylaws.




Revision of the National Bylaws in 1948 gave Districts full recognition under a special article devoted only to that subject.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Article IV Section 418 (a)(1) Commander
 - Preside at all meetings
 - Promote School of Instruction
 - Enforce strict observance of the laws and usages of this organization
 - Appoint officer, committee chairmen and committees not otherwise provided for
 - Assure all reports are correctly prepared
 - Assure that the District Inspector has properly inspected the books and records of the Posts within the District
 - Serve as a member of the Department Council of Administration

Appointments and Committee Chairs

Be thoughtful and selective in your selection/request.

- "Teamwork makes the Dream work"
- Match strengths and passion.
- Ask about availability.
- Stay away from Negative attitudes personality conflicts.

Appoint a Chief of Staff

- Trustworthy, Knowledgeable.
- Easy to reach and communicate.
- Preferable a Past District Commander or Officer.

District Veteran Service Information Officer

- Advocacy Assistance.
- Referrals for claims.
 Only VA accredited can assist
- Knowledge of VA procedures and programs.
- Local Resources.
- Direct line to Post Service Officers.

Committee Chairs:

- Youth Scholarship (Patriot Pen/Voice of Democracy) or keep separate.
- Americanism (Smart/Maher Teacher of the Year)
- POW/MIA
- Public Relations and or Media
